


WHERE IS TURKEY?

TURKEY is a vast peninsula, covering an area of 780,000 sq km and linking Asia to Europe through the Sea of Marmara and the Straits of İstanbul and Çanakkale.

Occupying a highly strategic position on the world map, Turkey combines the wealth of the East and the West, offering a synthesis of the traditional and the modern, the old and the new.

Bordering the Black Sea, between Bulgaria and Georgia, Aegean Sea and the Mediterranean Sea, between Greece and Syria, Turkey sits beautifully on the world map. Other bordering countries are Armenia, Azerbaijan, Iran and Iraq.

The 3% of Turkish territory north of the Straits lies in Europe renowned as the European Turkey, while the 97% of the country in Asia is referred to as Anatolia. Istanbul, which straddles the Bosporus, is the only metropolis in the world located on two continents.

Turkey has an extremely rich cultural heritage. Perhaps no other land has witnessed such diverse civilisations over the last 11,500 years, as did Turkey.



After the great Mesopotamians, the Hittite and Urartian kingdoms flourished in Anatolia. The Ionian and Roman civilisations predominated the western Anatolia.

İstanbul has the honour of having served as the capital of three successive empires – the

Roman, the Byzantine, and the Ottoman. Anatolia itself became a crossroads of peoples, cultures and religions.

Christianity, for example, thrived in these lands and Islam was glorified by the Seljuks and Ottomans.

VISA REGULATIONS

Diplomatic passport holders are exempt from visa for their travels to Turkey for up to 90 days.

Ordinary, Special and Service passport holders are required to have visa to enter Turkey. Ordinary, Special and Service passport holders with a valid Schengen members or USA, UK, Ireland visa or residence permit may get their single entry e-Visas valid for one month via the website www.evisa.gov.tr

You may apply for your e-visa on www.evisa. gov.tr and make payment with your credit card with in a short time.

Sticker visa

The sticker visa for Turkey can be easily applied at the Gateway visa processing centers in 16 cities of India with VIP/Premium lounge in selected ones. One can acquire the visa with limited number of documents.

Group Visas MICE Groups and Destination Weddings

The Visa process for guests of MICE and weddings can be co-handled with the organizer. The requirement of many personal documents is waived in such a case.

HOW TO GET TO TURKEY?



For over a decade now, the flight connectivity between Turkey&India has been rapidly growing and improving. Turkish Airlines and Indigo have daily direct flights to Turkey.

Turkish Airlines

Turkish Airlines is the National Flag carrier airline of Turkey. With a young fleet of 361 Aircrafts operating to 319 cites covering 322 airports.

Turkish airlines flies to 127 countries making it the only airlines which flies to maximum countries than any other airline.

In India, Turkish Airlines has daily departures from Delhi and Mumbai to its hub in Istanbul operating the latest state of the art aircraft offering inflight entertainment system, free Wi-Fi and meals on board.



Indigo

With its fleet of over 250 aircrafts, Indigo offers over 1500 daily flights and connects 63 domestic and 24 international destinations.

IndiGo's codeshare and mutual cooperation agreement with Turkish Airlines enable its customers to fly to 20 additional international destinations via Istanbul.

IndiGo operates double daily service between Delhi and Istanbul.

GETTING AROUND TURKEY

Air Connectivity

Turkey is considered as one of the most developed countries in Europe in terms of the connectivity and the volume of the aviation industry.

In the past decade, the international air transportation sector expanded 5.6% worldwide, while Turkey achieved the growth of 14%.

Turkey has more than 55 civil airports.

Istanbul Airport

Provides service in Istanbul, the intersection of Asia, Europe and the Middle East.

The Istanbul Airport serves as one of the world's most significant aviation hubs at a strategic geographical position connecting continents.

The Istanbul Airport launches flights to a total of 146 destinations at various continents within 3 hour connecting 120+ countries, 60+ capital cities, 250+ international and 50 domestic destinations.

When the airport is put into operation in full capacity, the number of flight destinations will exceed 350 and the numbers of the passengers will be 200 million.

One can find flights to destinations such as Antalya, Izmir, Cappadocia, Bodrum and Dalaman from Istanbul Airport.



Sabiha Gokcen Airport

Located in the Asian part of the Istanbul, Sabiha Gokcen Airport is only 1-hour drive from Istanbul Airport.

Both international and domestic flights operate from Sabiha Gokcen Airport.

Sabiha Gokcen Airport has been selected as the "Airport of the Year" in the 30+ million passenger capacity category at Center of Asia Pacific Aviation (CAPA) Awards for Excellence 2019.

Low cost airline companies like Pegasus and Anadolu Jet use Sabiha Gokcen Airport as their hubs.

One can find flights to destinations such as Antalya, Izmir, Cappadocia, Bodrum and Dalaman from Istanbul Airport.

High Speed Trains

Train travel through Turkey has become increasingly popular over the years as improvements have been made, with high-speed lines such as İstanbul–Ankara route. High speed trains connect Ankara, Istanbul, Konya, Eskisehir, with a speed up to 250 km/h.

ACCOMMODATION IN TURKEY

Turkey houses around 4600 Hotels with a total of 1.3 million bed capacity, out of which

• There are 670 5-Star hotels with a bed capacity of 5 lakhs.

•There are 820 4-star hotels with a bed capacity of 2.4 lakhs.

City hotels operate in destinations such as Istanbul and Izmir and Ankara. These usually operates on Bed and Breakfast system.

Resort Hotels with All Inclusive (AI) System operates in leisure destinations such as Antalya, Bodrum, Fethiye and Kuşadası.

In Turkey, almost 90% of the resort hotels operate on All Inclusive System which simplies that food and beverages (including liquor) consumed in the hotel are included in the accommodation package.

Most of the All-Inclusive resort hotels located in Antalya and Bodrum.

Apart from these, Special Category hotels also operate in Turkey. Historical Hotels and historical boutique hotels, Cave hotels (especially in Cappadocia region quite popular among the travellers.







WHAT TO EAT



Turkish Cuisine

Turkey may be famous for its kebabs, but this popular dish is just the tip of the iceberg when it comes to Turkish cuisine. Turkey's rich and diverse food culture is an ode to its geography and the heritage of Ottoman Palace kitchens. Hence, it is impossible to fit Turkish cuisine into a short list. Yet, it can be categorized based on ingredients and regions.

Turkish breakfast is a rich ex-

perience accompanied by local brewed black tea, bread and white cheese (similar to feta), old cheese black and/ or green olives butter, honey, jam, an omlette or boiled eggs sliced tomatoes and/or cucumbers.

Vegetable dishes: Turkish cuisine incorporates a huge range of vegetable dishes known as zeytinyagli yemegi - food cooked in olive oil. Traditional Turkish foods rely less on seasonings and more on tasty fresh ingredients.

Sea Food: A country located on a peninsula surrounded by three seas offers a rich variety of seafood dishes accompanied by small platters of `meze`, a selection of dishes served at the start of the meal.

Soups made with vegetables and grain, yogurt, pastries, deserts are most commonly additions to lunch or dinner menus.

Kebabs: Popularly known as the 'Kebap', this is the best known meat dish which offers a variety of grilled meat, meatballs or döner; beaten pieces of meat seasoned with suet, local herbs and spices, skewered on a spit and grilled vertically.

Indian restaurants can be found in destinations such as Antalya and Pamukkale as well.



As the cradle of Western and Eastern cultures, Turkey is the hub for some of the world's most important art and cultural events and festivals.



The Istanbul Music Festival is considered as the most prestigious and established classical music event in Turkey for more than 40 years and it takes place every year in June.



International Aspendos Opera and Ballet Festival (August-September, Antalya)

Bodrum International Ballet Festival

(July, Bodrum)

Bodrum International Ballet Festival is one of the most prestigious ballet festivals in Turkey and brings together high-quality ballet performances from various countries. Performances take place during July in Bodrum's historic castle of the Knights of St John.









•Gastronomy Festivals Cesme-Alaçatı Herb Festival (April, İstanbul)

Alaçatı Herb Festival can be regarded as one of the greatest examples of traditional and local gastronomy festivals in Turkey. At this festival, visitors can find various herbs of the Aegean region, dishes made with these herbs, and can participate in food workshops and concerts organized in the festival area.

Urgup Grape Harvest Festival (October, Cappadocia)

Cappadocia is one of the major grapes and wine producing region in Central Anatolia and the Grape Harvest Festival is one of the most important autumn events of the region which takes place in Urgup every October.

• Traditional Festivals Kırkpınar Oil Wrestling Championship (July, Edirne)

Kırkpınar Oil Wrestling Championship is 600-year-old traditional sports competition held in Edirne every year in the month of June.

Mevlana Whirling Dervishes Festival (Seb-i Arus)

(December, Konya)

Mevlana Whirling Dervishes Festival is held to celebrate the thoughts of one of the world's greatest philosophers and the father of the Mevlevi sect. The festival is organized in Konya every year in the month of December, offering a great spiritual experience through the music and dance performances of the dervishes.
